Dear East Lake Parents and Caregivers,

It's hard to believe that spring break is here! My wish for you is some time for rest, relaxation, and togetherness. How can we keep the momentum of learning going over the break? Absolutely any situation can be turned into a learning opportunity when we are with our Eagles with a little thought and creativity.

Literacy- reading books, magazines, recipes, assembly instructions, blogs, web pages, and menus. Spending time looking at signs, charts and graphs. Think crossword puzzles, word searches and letter recognition. Talk about what you see!
