Our staggered entry allows students to get to know our building and some of the routines in a quieter setting. With 960 students, it is very easy to feel overwhelmed, even when the school is familiar.

BUS ROUTES

- If your child rides a bus to and from school, RVS will contact you with a bus route number (ie 47, 114, 251, etc). East Lake School does not coordinate bussing.
- We are primarily a bused school, with 15 buses dropping off and picking up students each day.
- Our BUS LANE is for buses and our families with students in the PIP program. Please do not enter the bus lane to drop off or pick up your child. Safety is our priority

PLEASE ENSURE YOUR CHILD KNOWS WHICH BUS ROUTE HE/SHE RIDES. WRITE THIS ROUTE NUMBER ON YOUR CHILD'S BUS PASS. It makes finding a lost bus much easier at the end of the day.


Mission and Vision at East Lake

- Positive Behaviour Intervention Strategies (PBIS) are used in all we do.
- Expected behaviours are TAUGHT and REINFORCED throughout the whole school.

 - Assemblies

- Reviewing the expectations for all common and shared areas on a regular basis is important.

Your Child's Teacher is the First Contact

- It is important to connect with your child's teacher. The teachers will send out information about the classroom and learning.
- Should issues or concerns arise, please contact the teacher first.

Restoring Relationships

- Conflict is a normal part of growing up and working with different people or in different environments. Not all conflict constitutes bullying.
- All of us will experience conflict at one point in our lives. It is important we help our students navigate resolutions and move forward.
- At East Lake, we use restorative practices to help students deal with conflicts that arise. We take all concerns seriously and find including students in the process is the best course of action.
- Should your child come home with concerns or a specific incident, please contact your child's teacher to discuss what has happened.
- Learning to promote better future interactions is the goal.



Student Safety

- Kinniburgh Boulevard can be very busy during drop-off and pick-up. Please ensure you teach your child how to safely navigate crossing the street. The best way is to use the designated crosswalks.
- Consider an alternative drop-off and pick-up point at the edge of the back field on East Lakeview Road
- Our parking lot is CLOSED between 7:45 and 2:50. There are pylons out to remind everyone to stay out of the parking lot.
- The BUS LANE is for BUSES. Unless your child is part of our PIP program, please refrain from dropping your child off in the bus lane.

 If for any reason there are court documents regarding access to or the safety of your child, please ensure the school is aware. We need these documents on file in order to follow them.

Alternative Drop off and Pick up East Lakeview Road

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
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Drop off and Pick up for Grade 3, 5, 6


