Dear Parents and Supporters of East Lake School,

I was the student that found math challenging and intimidating through school. I remember vividly in first grade being at the board, alone, and getting the answer wrong in front of the entire class. I felt embarrassed, on the spot and developed a confidence issue with math from then out. I moved through high school and got through- with lots of attempts at memorization, text book repetition, work sheets, teacher led instruction and tests. I wonder if any pieces of this sound familiar with your own school experiences?

Our Building Thinking Classrooms professional development brings a different face to math (and other learning tasks across subjects). We have been engaging in a year long book study of "Building Thinking Classrooms" and working in team with RVS Learning Specialists to have a common staff professional learning experience. I saw many of you attempting math tasks at Student Led'sbravo! Here is a quick run down in case this is a new concept for you.

A Building Thinking Classroom activity features randomized groupings of students. You may see students standing and far more active. The classroom is arranged to promote collaboration and comfort. You could see students working in team at vertical or on non permanent surfaces. You could see students approaching a well developed task that is thought provoking. Students are brainstorming, communicating, recording and testing their ideas. Perhaps they view the work of others out of curiosity. The teacher could be mindfully circulating, supporting and observing learning. The lesson would feature a consolidation process using student produced learning. Assessment is primarily formative and could happen through observation, discussion or product.

Compare these two scenarios for a moment. One feels far more inclusive, active, creative and engaging. I'm excited to see these principles coming alive at East Lake and offering both vertical and horizontal alignment within our school. Interested in learning more?
