This week, our school community engaged in meaningful learning and activities in recognition of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation (Tuesday, September 30). Our commitment to learning about Indigenous Ways of Knowing and Being is ongoing and aligns with both the Alberta Program of Studies (Curriculum) and the Alberta Teacher and Leadership Quality Standards, which requires educators and school leaders to develop and apply foundational knowledge about First Nations, Métis, and Inuit for the benefit of all students.

As adults, we, too, are on our own journey with truth and reconciliation. This journey is about being open—willing to learn, reflect, and also to unlearn. It requires humility, listening, and a commitment to growth as we work alongside students in building understanding and respect.

We would like to extend our gratitude to RVS Indigenous Learning for supporting our Grades 7–9 lacrosse residency in partnership with the Alberta Lacrosse Association. Lacrosse, also known as the "Medicine Game," holds deep cultural significance and supports spiritual, diplomatic, and ceremonial practices in Indigenous communities.

On Thursday, students participated in Orange Shirt Day, a day to honor the experiences of children who were taken from their families to attend residential schools—many of whom never returned—and to acknowledge and support survivors and their families.

Our Indigenous Learning Staff Champions thoughtfully designed learning opportunities throughout the week. These included sharing curated storybooks, creating orange hearts for a school-wide display, and spending time in nature through sharing circles, sit spots, and reflection on the land.

At East Lake School, we integrate Indigenous perspectives into daily learning. Our focus on Peter Lilejedahl's "Building Thinking Classrooms" supports the decolonization of education, emphasizing collaboration, community, and respect.

Each child—and each person—matters at East Lake School.
